THIS PANDEMIC HAS NOT STOPPED THE WORD OF GOD

Having to shut down Ministry Centers from producing, and closing the doors to the Home Office was a new and somewhat scary situation. But this situation didn't stop the Bible, Devotionals, and Magazines from going out!

Our Lord and Savior knew this was going to happen. He prepared us (staff & volunteers) as we had three months of magazines already produced and our shelves were full with volumes of the Bible and Devotionals, produced by you, before the shutdown.

Yes, we had to send The Team home. Did you know that one of our team members lives less than a block away? She would come in the early morning to process the mail, donations, and pay the bills that continued to come in. Another team member lives in a home on the property. He would go into the office in the evening to pull, pack, and ship Braille and Large Print, while also working on the landscaping. Our President and his wife not only worked from home, they would come in on the weekend to work on mailings and promotional items.

Others team members continued to format Large Print and produce Audio which they mailed directly from their homes. Some team members trained, through webinars and Zoom, on new programs to improve and streamline processes. A couple of team members snuck into the office to paint the volunteer room and prepare Bay 9 for our new tenant. See more about this in the pages ahead.

The rest of the staff at home were just as busy. You can read more about what they've been up to in the pages ahead. We worked on obtaining a Personal Payroll Protection Loan. We were blessed that prayers were answered and the Lord stepped in and allowed a bank to provide a loan during the second round. This loan will turn into a grant once we complete the process.


This pandemic didn't stop the phone from ringing. Our readers have been isolating for most, if not, all of

Working from home has been a vivid reminder to me that many of our recipients live a "Stay at Home Order" type of isolation as a normal part of their life. I feel very blessed that I have had the privilege of continuing to receive their phone calls, which in many cases make their day and make mine as well. How many people have a job where you have phone calls all over the country with someone you either spoke with for the first time, or have known only by phone for many years, which ends with "I am praying for you"? We have one recipient that has called a few times just to sing us all an encouraging song-- what a blessing!

I have been able to continue to receive and respond to all emails that come into the LBW website as well as receive and process all the Braille and Large Print orders.

Our Braille transcribers have all continued to work through this Pandemic so we would have files ready for production when our office reopened. We have not missed many issues which is a blessing to our recipients.

Much of my time has been spent learning and perfecting the new system for monthly labels. We have sent labels out to a few centers over the past two months and so far I have not heard of any issues; hopefully this means the labels are working out well.

I also spend many hours cleaning up records so when we convert to our new system, everything will be ready.

At this time the post office still has suspended mail to many foreign countries but this will not slow down our production. We will continue to fulfill these labels and if you cannot ship, or do not have space to store, please send them back to our warehouse for us to hold and ship in the future. You can check the post office site to see which countries are on hold or if you try to do a customs form it will not allow you if that country is on hold.

LBW- STILL ADVANCING THE MINISTRY



Despite the office being closed, and the restrictions on travel, we are making strides to keep this ministry operating and funded. Our donors continue to generously support the ministry in the belief people who are Visually Impaired deserve the Gospel message now as much as ever before. We continue to apply for grants with foundations around the United States, and this summer have already been approved for a number of grants from the wonderful, generous ladies of multiple LWML Districts.

We are still raising money to match a very generous award from the James L. Stamps Foundation (based in Southern California) in order to purchase a brand new forklift for use in our warehouse. Our existing forklift is over 40 years old and finally ready to retire. This machine is invaluable in transporting the 800lb rolls of paper in addition to the thousands of tons of books, cardboard, and pallets, every single year. This forklift will be purchased by the fall as we continue to move our ministry forward.

Finally, we have extended the Buy-A-Dot campaign due to COVID-19. We are hoping to wrap the campaign in the fall once most, if not all, of our centers have returned so we can celebrate this success together. We look forward to celebrating the efforts of everybody coming together to purchase this beautiful Plate Embossing Device to create the zinc plates so instrumental to our Braille ministry! UPDATE-INVOICES AND PURCHASE ORDERS

There is a new purchasing system in place at headquarters which has resulted in new Invoice and Purchase Orders being sent to the Ministry Production Centers and some questions have arisen we would like to briefly address.

Some of you have already asked about the sections-- "Pay Invoice" and "Your Support to Cover the Invoice."

Lutheran Braille Workers has always requested our Ministry Production Centers help at least cover the cost of their expenditures through the financial support of their churches, volunteers, or communities. In fact, this is part of the Memorandum of Understanding signed when a new Ministry Production Center is opened. Additionally, in recent years, there have been a growing number of Ministry Production Centers requesting a clearer picture of what expenses their centers are generating to help them raise the funds to offset these costs. This section of the Invoice is intended to help our leaders track these expenses from the Home Office in an easier manner.

The Purchase Orders are not bills you must pay directly to the vendors. We are asking you to use these to ensure you are receiving everything which is ordered, as well as to help track total expenses being generated at your Ministry Production Center.

The work being done at your center is greatly appreciated, and the amount of volunteer hours given each year is necessary for this ministry to continue. It is not our intention or desire to ever shut down a center simply because the expenses may not be met every year; the volunteer labor produced is worth far more to this ministry. You will continue to receive the supplies you need to function whenever you order them. However, please know, we will continue to ask you to both meet your costs and also raise additional funds to support LBW at the national and international level. This will be reflected in the new paperwork being sent out.

SUPPORTING SMALL BUSINESS IN A BIG WAY


